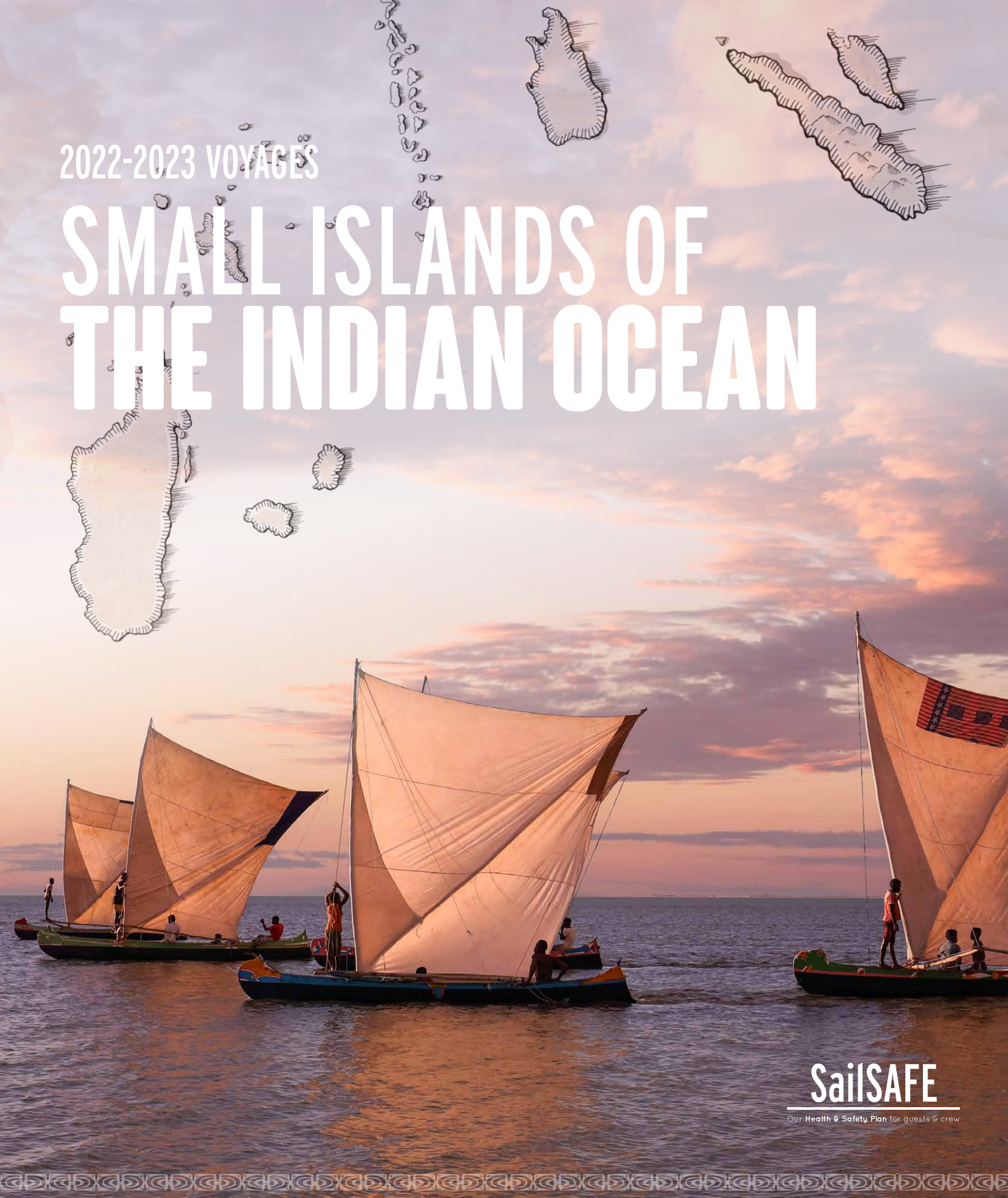

ITINERARY: 25 NIGHTS > SINGAPORE TO SEYCHELLES

DAY 1: SINGAPORE

Check in at Singapore Cruise Terminal at 2:30pm to board at 4:00pm. Depart at 6:00pm and meet your fellow guests, Captain and crew at the Captain's welcome drinks.

DAYS 2-25:

This is an indicative itinerary covering remote areas. Your Expedition Team will make changes to the daily schedule as necessary to maximise guest experience.

AT SEA

This itinerary includes a total of 10 days at sea to reach these destinations. During sea days, relax or join our Expedition Team for a program of interactive workshops and presentations.

MELAKA - MALAYSIA

Kota Melaka, or Malacca City, is the capital of the Malaysian state of Malacca. It has a long and illustrious history of trade and influence, due to its significant location on the Strait of Malacca - one of the most important shipping lanes in the world. Colonial influences, rich history, and peaceful coexistence of many different peoples make Malacca a fascinating tourist destination

Here, we arrive early before the heat of the day. There is much to see, so tours will reveal the city to us. After a break for lunch, enjoy a cruise along the Melaka River.

PENANG - MALAYSIA

A day's sailing takes us up the scenic coast of Malaysia to arrive into Penang at the lively city of Georgetown. Famous for its fascinating blend of colonial, Indian, Malay and - especially - immigrant Chinese culture and food, enjoy a traditional dinner on shore and soak up the atmosphere. In the morning, wander through the architectural heritage of Georgetown, with its spectacular Chinese temples and guildhalls. The city feels frozen in time, with the historical centre earning the status of UNESCO World Heritage site. The history is only the beginning - incredible street art and street food provide a feast for the senses.

SABANG, WEH ISLAND - INDONESIA

This sleepy island city is known for its beauty and cleanliness. Ride a becak to see the Dutch colonial buildings, enjoy a cultural performance by the local children and visit the otherworldly bubbling pools of geothermal Jaboi Valley. Later, explore the dive sites at Seulako Island, where schools of fish flock around the coral walls in the clear water.

BANDA ACEH - INDONESIA

Today, we explore Banda Aceh. This city was hit hard by the Boxing Day Tsunami of 2004. Learn about the events of that day and visit the remarkable museum and memorial park. Tour the Grand Mosque and enjoy free time to explore, before a traditional meal and a display of the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Practice, the Saman Dance. Enjoy time to relax and explore before we commence our ocean crossing to Sri Lanka.

HAMBANTOTA & YALA NATIONAL PARK, SRI LANKA

After time at sea, arrive in Sri Lanka. We make our way overland on a scenic journey to soak up the surrounds of Sri Lanka. Enjoy stops to explore small villages before arriving a Yala National Park for our special event: a dusk safari experience with the opportunity to spot elephants and elusive leopards before we sit down to a Sri Lankan feast in the evening. Tonight, stay overnight at the wilderness resort on the edge of the National Park.

GALLE, SRI LANKA

An overland journey back to the coast takes us to Galle, through charming southern Sri Lanka. Along the way, stop at pristine beaches, village markets and visit one of Sri Lanka's iconic tea plantations. In Galle, have free time to explore the Fort and city. The next morning, see Galle and the surrounds your own way: tour with local guides, visit the Temple, cycle through paddy fields, or try your hand at making traditional Sri Lankan curry.

KULHUDHUFFUSHI - MALDIVES

After time at sea, begin your exploration of the exquisite coral atolls that comprise the nation of the Maldives at Kulhudhuffushi City. Enjoy water activities off the white sand beaches of a stunning atoll island. Snorkel over the coral gardens, stroll under the palm trees, and meet the kind and courteous Maldivians.

HANIFARU BAY & OLHUGIRI, MALDIVES

Thanburan Reef at Hanifaru Bay is famous for its marine life. This is a protected area, and you will have the extraordinary experience of exploring the vibrant underwater world and spotting marine life. Later, visit Olhugiri for more activities and relaxing nature walks. This island is known for breeding red-billed tropic bird and nesting turtles.

MAALHAVELI, MEEMU ATOLL - MALDIVES

Explore the uninhabited island of Maalhaveli. This atoll is a true paradise and geographic marvel. With incredible marine biodiversity, enjoy snorkelling and drift dives over vibrant reefs with the chance to spot manta rays or reef sharks.

HITHADHOO, ADDU ATOLL, MALDIVES

Arrive in Hithadhoo in the afternoon and explore Addu National Park to spot birdlife, before time to explore the city, go shopping and enjoy Maldivian cuisine before we depart.

PRASLIN, SEYCHELLES

After time at sea, arrive in the Seychelles at the island of Praslin. A drive the scenic coastal road through quaint fishing villages sets the scene, before you arrive at the UNESCO World Heritage Vallee de Mai Nature Reserves. Here, marvel at the forest of 6,000 Coco de Mer palms, with their enormous fan-shaped fronds and famously suggestive seeds. Later, Cote d'Or is perfect for a swim or walk.

LA DIGUE & CURIEUSE, SEYCHELLES

Awake to the amazing view of La Digue. This is the most well-known island of Seychelles because of the spectacular rock formations and huge granite boulders. Our first stop is at L'Union estate, a former coconut and vanilla plantation, where we will gain insights into the colonial history of the island. Encounter giant tortoises, enjoy strolling around the grounds of the majestic plantation house, and relax on 'the most beautiful beach in the world', Anse Source d'Argent.

In the afternoon, visit Curieuse Island. This island has a tragic history, having been home to a leper colony, and still bearing the marks of a 1771 fire. Now giant tortoises roam free and Seychelles black parrot can be spotted amongst the Coco de Mer palms.

ARIDE, SEYCHELLES

Aride is home to some of the most important seabird populations in the Indian Ocean. With the world's largest colonies of Lesser Noddy and Tropical Shearwater, along with 18 other species, the island provides wonderful birdwatching opportunities. Enjoy nature walks, looking out for Sooty Terns, Red-tailed Tropicbird, Frigatebirds, Brown Noddy, and Wedge-tailed Shearwater. This stop is subject to weather conditions.

DAY 26: ARRIVE MAHE, SEYCHELLES

This morning, we arrive at Mahé to disembark at 8:00am.

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ITINERARY: 15 NIGHTS > SEYCHELLES TO MAURITIUS

DAY 1: DEPART MAHÉ, SEYCHELLES

Board in Mahé, Seychelles at 2:00pm for a 4:00pm departure.

DAYS 2-15:

This is an indicative itinerary covering remote areas. Your Expedition Team will make changes to the daily schedule as necessary to maximise guest experience.

AT SEA

This itinerary includes a total of 2 days at sea to reach these destinations. During sea days, relax or join our Expedition Team for a program of interactive workshops and presentations.

POIVRE, SEYCHELLES

Poivre is a small island atoll home to a handful of caretakers and conservationists. Poivre Island has a grandiose history, which is seen in ruined buildings standing amongst modern homes. Once used for farming vanilla, maize and livestock, the island is an important breeding area for turtles and numerous birds. Enjoy a day of snorkelling in the beautiful lagoon or spend time birdwatching on the peaceful island.

ALPHONSE ISLANDS, SEYCHELLES

Today, if conditions allow, we will stop at the island of Alphonse, St. François and Bijoutier, which boast miles of spectacular beaches and lagoons brimming with marine life and brilliant coral. They are considered to be some of the most spectacular islands in the Seychelles. Here, snorkel in the crystal-clear water.

FARQUHAR GROUP, SEYCHELLES

An Important Bird Area, the Farquhar Group provides incredible bird-watching. Green sea turtles and Hawksbill Turtles nest around the edges of the lagoon and snorkelling or nature walks are the order of the day, should conditions allow.

ALDABRA GROUP, SEYCHELLES

The second-largest coral atoll in the world, Aldabra Atoll is UNESCO World Heritage protected and due to its isolation, has remained untouched by humans. It is home to an estimated 152,000 giant tortoises, and abounds with other marine and bird life. With two days in the Aldabra Group, we have flexibility in our exploration, spending our time walking in nature, spotting wildlife, snorkelling, or relaxing on one of the many beaches.

ASSUMPTION ISLAND, SEYCHELLES

This morning, we arrive at Assumption Island, in the Outer Islands. This single coral island has a history of plantations and mining, leaving exposed rock and caves, with low growing vegetation. The 5km long white beach is a lovely base for snorkelling and Scuba diving, should conditions allow.

Earning her stripes driving vessels, Dawn has been fortunate to circumnavigate the world almost twice, visiting and leading expeditions in many different countries and remote areas. She has a passion for photography, biology and the natural world.

NOSY BE, MADAGASCAR

Nosy Be means Big Island in Malagasy. This is one of the primary locations in Madagascar for travellers, but still sleepy enough to intrigue.

Our tour of Nosy Be begins at the Ylang Ylang distillery. Continue on to a private park, home to lemurs, chameleons, and tortoises. Visit the colourful *bazary be* market of Hell-ville, which provides a view on real Madagascan life. End your exploration at Mount Passot, for splendid views over volcanic lakes and islands.

ANTSIRANANA, MADAGASCAR

Antsiranana, the largest city in northern Madagascar, is a gateway to the wonders of this region. Your day includes a choice of expeditions.

Tour Montagne d'Ambre National Park, one of the most biodiverse places in Madagascar. This is one of the best places to observe chameleons.

Tour the city of Antsiranana, gaining an insight into the fascinating history, colonial impacts and local cultures. Shop in the Rue Colbert or visit Ramena Beach.

The final option, for those who are physically fit, is an overland journey to Ankarana, known for incredible Tsingy formations. Visit historic caves used by the Antankarana people in the 1800s.

NOSY MANGABE & MASOALA N.P.

Nosy Mangabe is a 520-hectare island reserve and one of the most diverse areas of virgin rain forest in Madagascar. Embark on nature walks to spot wildlife. For the birders, look for Madagascar buzzard, kingfisher and paradise flycatchers. At Masoala, have the chance to spot red-ruffed lemur, red-fronted brown lemur, and ring-tailed mongoose, as well as a multitude of extraordinary chameleons. The walks and hikes are suitable for all fitness levels. Later, we may swim at the beach or visit the village.

NOSY BORAHA (ÎLE SAINTE-MARIE)

This island off the east coast of Madagascar has lush vegetation interspersed with many small villages. The bays and coves are protected by coral reefs and we will learn the fascinating history of the pirates who took refuge here. Walk the botanical trail to the church, before visiting the colourful market, with time to purchase handicrafts and marvel at the entire sperm whale skeleton on display. Later, stop at a beautiful island beach for swimming.

SAINT-DENIS, RÉUNION

Known for its dramatic landscapes, Réunion was formed by a massive submerged volcano. A full day tour visits the huge volcanic amphitheatres known as cirques, where mountains tower overhead, and waterfalls plummet hundreds of feet. Be surrounded by plantations of spices, vanilla, and fruits. Take in the extraordinary views over Nez des Boeufs and Piton de la Fournaise. We will enjoy a delicious Creole lunch before enjoying free time in the afternoon. The next morning gives us time to explore the city, or take an optional helicopter tour (additional cost) to take in more of the magnificent geography of the island.

DAY 16: PORT LOUIS, MAURITIUS

Arrive in Port Louis, Mauritius, to disembark at 9:00am.

17 NIGHTS | 19 FEBRUARY 2023

- > Walk down the impressive Avenue of the Baobabs, lined with the towering bottle-shaped trees
- > Visit the Southern Hemisphere's oldest building, the Chapel of Nossa Senhora de Baluarte, and wander the historic streets of the Island of Mozambique
- > Explore the ruins of the medieval sultanate of Kilwa Kisiwani, a 14th century city of grand proportions

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ITINERARY: 17 NIGHTS > PORT LOUIS TO ZANZIBAR

DAY 1: DEPART PORT LOUIS, MAURITIUS

Board at Port Louis Terminal at 3:00pm for a 5:00pm departure.

DAYS 2-17:

This is an indicative itinerary covering remote areas. Your Expedition Team will make changes to the daily schedule as necessary to maximise guest experience.

AT SEA

This itinerary includes a total of 6 days at sea to reach these destinations. During sea days, relax or join our Expedition Team for a program of interactive workshops and presentations.

RÉUNION

A choice of excursions at magnificent Réunion are available - either a full day tour or a half day morning tour. The full day tour takes in the central highlands where rugged peaks of dormant or extinct volcanoes and mountains rising over 3,000m dominate the landscape. The air is scented with vanilla and plunging waterfalls tumble into vast cirques. Take in spectacular views from Nez des Boeuf of the Piton de la Fournaise crater before lunch at a creole restaurant and a visit to Cite du Volcan museum. Learn about the important part that vanilla plays in Reunion's cultural heritage at St Andre vanilla plantation then explore St Denis. An optional helicopter tour (additional cost) is available to take in more of the magnificent geography of the island.

ISALO & ZOMBITSE-VOHIBASIA NATIONAL PARKS

Journey overland from coastal Toliara to Isalo National Park, stopping on the way at Zombitse National Park, where we will see baobab trees and perhaps even the White Shifaka Lemur.

Isalo National Park is known for its rugged landscape of imposing gorges and plunging canyons. On nature walks, spot the several species of lemur found in the park as well as many bird species. Your overnight accommodation will be at the Hotel Relais de la Reine and Hotel Jardin du Roy. In the morning, there is further opportunity to spot lemurs or enjoy a swim at a freshwater pool in the forest called Piscine Naturelle.

ANDAVADOAKA & NOSY HAO

The small fishing village of Andavadoaka sits on the edge of a tranquil lagoon protected by vibrant coral reefs and is home to semi-nomadic Vezo people who rely upon the ocean for their livelihood. We will learn about community projects promoting sustainable marine management before enjoying an afternoon of beach activities, swimming and snorkelling at Nosy Hao.

BELO SUR MER

At the village of Belo Sur Mer, we again enjoy the company of the Vezo people. The village sits on the shores of a turquoise lagoon with inviting white-sand beaches shaded by palm trees. This region of Madagascar is well-known for the traditional timber fishing boats, known as pirogues, which are built on the beach. When a vessel is launched, there is a festival-like atmosphere and we may be lucky enough to witness such an occasion.

MORONDAVA

In a country scarred by deforestation, Kirindy Reserve is a wildlife habitat for threatened species and is protected and managed through selective and sustainable logging. Covering around 125sq km, Kirindy's dry deciduous forests provide a haven for the endemic fossa, a cat-like mammal the size of a small greyhound, as well as lemurs, birds and reptiles including chameleons. In the afternoon, visit the famed Avenue of the Baobabs, known as the 'most beautiful road in Madagascar'. A local conservation campaign aiming to protect the Avenue as Madagascar's first natural monument in an often-treeless landscape.

MAHAJANGA

On arrival at Mahajanga, travel to Cirque Rouge. Cirque Rouge is a multi-colored circular rock formation that recalls red American canyons, with hills carved by large gullies. Erosion has revealed a wide range of colours in the sandstone surface, from white, pink, orange to ochre shades. Local people collect the colourful sand to create souvenirs, such as drawing images in bottles.

MOZAMBIQUE ISLAND

The fortified city of Mozambique and former Portuguese trading post on the Island of Mozambique is a UNESCO World Heritage site, significant for its remarkable 16th century architectural features. Connected to the mainland by a 3.4km long bridge straddling the Indian Ocean, the island has two distinct types of dwellings: the stone and lime town of Swahili, Arab and European influence in the north and traditional African *macuti* town - city of roofed palm leaves - in the south. Enjoy walking tours to discover the island's diverse cultures and charming communities, as well as the Chapel of Nossa Senhora de Baluarte, the oldest European building in the Southern Hemisphere.

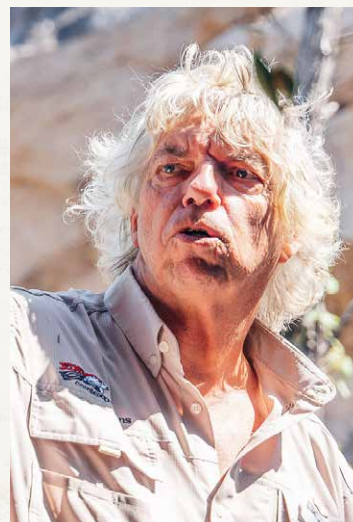
KILWA KISIWANI

The UNESCO World Heritage Ruins of Kilwa Kisiwani, once a medieval sultanate and occupied from the 9th to the 19th century, was described as one of the most beautiful cities of the world in its heyday. Wander around the magnificent ruins of Malindi Mosque, Fort Gereza, a former prison built atop the ruins of a Portuguese fort, and the tombs of the Sultans. Husuni Kubwa, a Sultan's palace of grand proportions down to its octagonal swimming pool, was similar to those found in Syria, Turkey and the Persian Gulf.

On our final evening onboard *Coral Geographer*, reminisce about your voyage with new friends at the Captain's Farewell Drinks.

DAY 18: ARRIVE ZANZIBAR

Arrive in Zanzibar at 8:00am to disembark at 9:00am. Spend time in the historic spice-trading town, and enjoy a post-cruise exploration through the fascinating streets of Stone Town and its dhow-crowded harbour.

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ITINERARY: 17 NIGHTS > BROOME TO SINGAPORE

DAY 1: BROOME

Board *Coral Geographer* at 8:30am to depart at 10:00am.

DAYS 2-17:

This is an indicative itinerary covering remote areas. Your Expedition Team will make changes to the daily schedule as necessary to maximise guest experience.

AT SEA

This itinerary includes a total of 6 days at sea to reach these destinations. During sea days, relax or join our Expedition Team for a program of interactive workshops and presentations.

TABLOLONG BAY, TIMOR

After a day at sea, spent learning about Indonesia from our guest lecturers, and meeting your fellow guests and crew and the Captain's welcome drinks, your first stop is at the sweeping white sand beach of Tablolong Bay. Clear into Indonesia, before going ashore for a special welcoming ceremony. Traditional dance accompanied by Sasando music from neighbouring Rote Island will delight you and you are welcome to participate in the joyful ceremony. Stroll along the unspoilt shoreline or take to the clear warm waters for a snorkel or a swim.

ALOR ISLAND

This morning, enjoy a relaxing morning snorkel, before cruising through spectacular scenery toward Kalabahi Port, surrounded by mountains that overlook the river. Go ashore to visit the town's bustling market and then the Moko Drum Museum on the way to the Village of Abui people. At Alor, observe the traditional Lego-Lego dance, a symbol of the strength and brotherhood of the Abui tribe. Joining hands in a circle, the rhythmic dance is performed to welcome guests as an expression of happiness. Celebrate this amazing experience by joining the circle and dancing alongside the Abui people.

WAKATOBI MARINE PARK

Today, explore the third largest marine park in Indonesia. Wakatobi covers 1.4 million hectares hosting 900,000 tropical coral reefs and is home to the highest number of fish species in the world. Our destination, Hoga Island, is the quintessential Wakatobi experience with turquoise waters and reefs brimming with colours and sea life. Passengers can snorkel, kayak, dive and beachcomb on our visit to experience all the natural wonder this location has to offer, during the year's best weather conditions.

BAUBAU, BUTON ISLAND

At Baubau we will be immersed in the rich Buton culture. Upon arrival, be greeted with a traditional dance performance at the wharf before being transported to visit the historic *Benteng Keraton Buton* - Buton Palace Fortress, known as the world's largest fortress. Standing atop a steep hill since the 16th century, the fort allows for views of sprawling views all the way to the Strait of Buton. The fort has served a critical role in the history of the Buton people. After exploring the fort, you'll have time to wander the vibrant town square and explore the traditional market. Later, visit a fisherman's village, and observe the creation of handwoven ikat textiles at Sula Village.

TAKABONERATE NATIONAL PARK

Tinabo Island, at the heart of the Taka Bonerate National Park, feels like a far-flung private paradise. With a white sandy beach and a plethora of surrounding reefs, the island is part of the Takabonerate Atoll. This atoll is of major ecological importance, brimming with marine and bird life.

Spend time enjoying the clear turquoise waters with snorkelling, diving and kayaking. Famous throughout Indonesia, there is the opportunity to stand in the clear waters on the beach and

interact with shark pups swimming around your legs. Finally, take part in the important conservation work of preserving the island's landscape by planting casuarina trees. You may also have a chance to learn about the other conservation efforts occurring here, such as work preserving turtle populations and transplanting of coral reefs.

MATASIRI ISLAND, BORNEO

Matasiri belongs to the archipelago of the Laut Kecil islands of Borneo. The island is a secluded destination where you can find sanctuary in the sheltered bay and explore by paying a visit to the village and swimming/snorkelling in the pristine waters. This stop is a rare expedition style location where you can take a walk along the sand and soak in the unspoiled native flora and fauna.

KUMAI & TANJUNG PUTING NATIONAL PARK

Tanjung Puting National Park is a remarkable destination. Start your exploration by cruising along the uncanny inky-black waters of the Nipah waterway and the winding Sekonyer River. Along the way, look out for some of the rare wildlife that take haven in this tropical forest, including clouded leopards, proboscis monkeys, sambar deer and Malayan sunbears. The area is home to over 230 bird species such as hornbills, crimson sunbirds and wetland species. However, the highlight of our day will be the opportunity to see orangutans in their natural habitat. This National Park is a conservation area for this endangered species, and conservation efforts include the establishment of 4 research centres by the Leakey Foundation and Orangutan Foundation.

On our second day at Kumai, Christmas Day, we will explore the Bulu river, a narrow river through dense mangroves, for an immersive experience in nature. Later, celebrate Christmas onboard with special dinner before a relaxing day at sea.

SUNGSANG VILLAGE

Today, go ashore at a traditional fishing village at the mouth of the Musi River. After a brilliantly coloured traditional dance performance by the locals, discover the rural beauty of Sungsang village. Here, walk along the narrow boardwalk lanes lined with stilt houses on the water and enjoy local snacks and delicacies. One of the highlights of this destination is meeting the local people, and returning the smiles of local children. The distinction between this region and the eastern archipelago will fascinate you, as you gain insights into Indonesia's rich rural culture.

TANJUNG KELIAN

Tanjung Kelian, on the west coast of Bangka Island, is primarily known for its sturdy white and red lighthouse, built by the Dutch in 1862. We will visit this historic lighthouse tower, and those who wish to may climb the 117 stone steps that wind up to the top of the tower to be rewarded with panoramic ocean views.

Tanjung Kelian has a historically significant and culturally rich past. Guided by our team, discover the Bangka Massacre monument and learn about the event it commemorates. Visit locations such as the Chinese mayor's house, the township of Muntok to learn about the region, and witness a traditional Borongsai dance and Wushu martial arts at Kong Fuk Miao temple. Before we leave, there may be time to relax on the beach below the lighthouse, and meet the locals who gather here to enjoy the soft white sand and communal atmosphere.

DAY 18: ARRIVE SINGAPORE

After a day at sea, spent relaxing and reflecting on our extraordinary journey, farewell you fellow guests, Captain and crew at the Captain's Farewell Drinks. In the morning, *Coral Geographer* will sail into Singapore Cruise Centre at around 8:00am for a 9:00am disembarkation.

DAY 1: DEPART ZANZIBAR

Board in Zanzibar, Tanzania, at 5:00pm for a 7:00pm departure.

DAYS 2-19: AT SEA

Spend 18 carefree days at leisure as we cross the Indian Ocean from west to east. As dusk falls each day, join your fellow travellers, the captain and crew for evening drinks and enjoy the delicious simplicity of our cuisine, inspired by the region we depart from and using fresh regional produce. Experience the warm company of our renowned Australian hospitality team and take time to socialise with fellow passengers, catch up on book reading or writing or simply relax as the Indian Ocean slips by. This is the ultimate retreat - a detox from modern life with time to relax. You might even find the time to finish a project you've been working on or write your first book.

You will share the waves with migratory seabirds and marine life along the way. Guest presenters, storytellers and an extensive onboard program with hands-on practical lessons will be on offer throughout the voyage. This includes a program on traditional and modern Navigation.

Over the first days of the voyage, guests will receive an introduction on the basic theory of navigation and instruction chart plotting, reading a compass and log, and taking astronomical sights. With the assistance of the professional navigators aboard, complex calculations are minimised, so that all participants can fully take part. Participants will regularly read the magnetic compass and the traditional towed log that will be streamed over the stern and record these readings in the logbook. Using these figures, a dead-reckoning position will be plotted on the plotting ship and corrected, when possible, by sun observations using the sextant and chronometer. A daily noon position will then be transferred to the Indian Ocean chart to track our progress. At the end of the voyage, you will have a unique record of your ocean crossing, recorded on the chart and in the logbook, and a set of instruments to take home.

You can also choose to attend daily yoga and meditation classes and find peace and stillness as the waves slip by. Choose from vigorous sunrise sessions on the vista deck, weather permitting, or slow afternoon sessions in the lounge to reset your internal compass. Our onboard instructor will guide you through, so these sessions will be suitable for all experience levels. Our onboard gym is also available for those who prefer to run or use weights.

Our guest lecturer will also hold evening star-gazing sessions as he shares insights on astronomy and how the stars were an important guide for navigators around the world in times past. Enjoy a glass of champagne while taking in the spectacular night sky, far away from any light pollution. This is sure to be a highlight of your voyage.

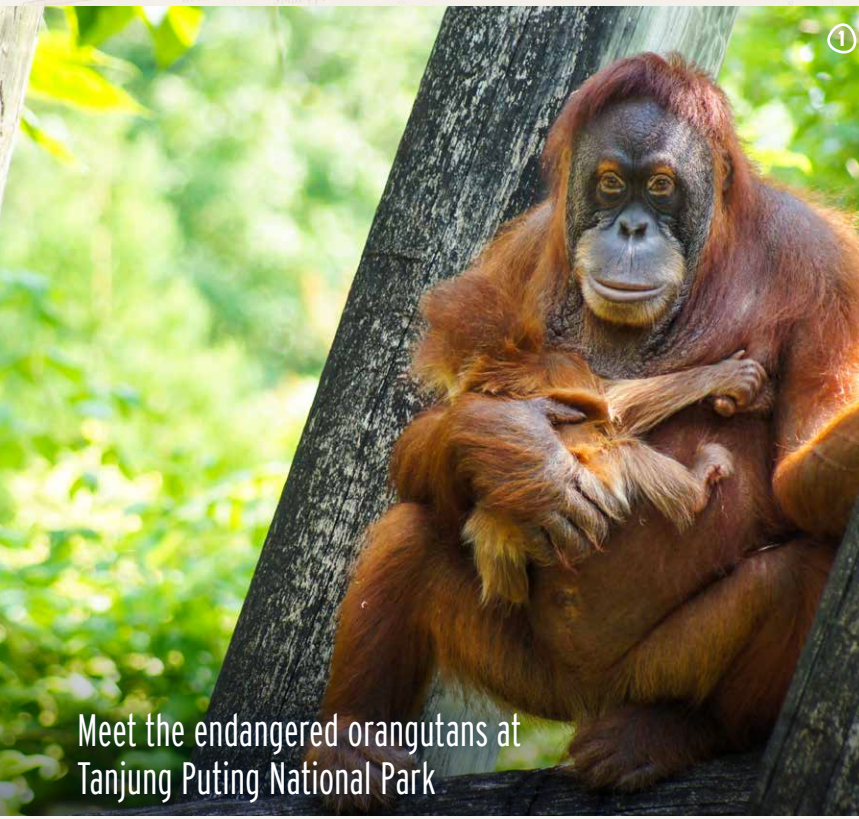

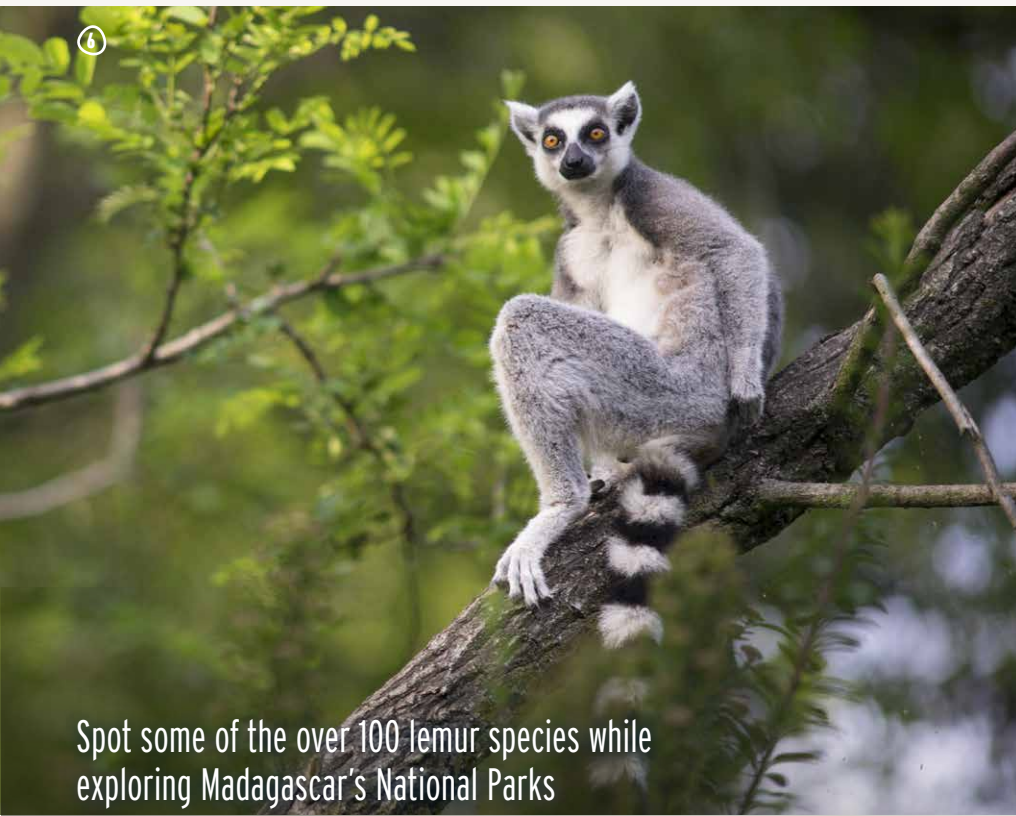

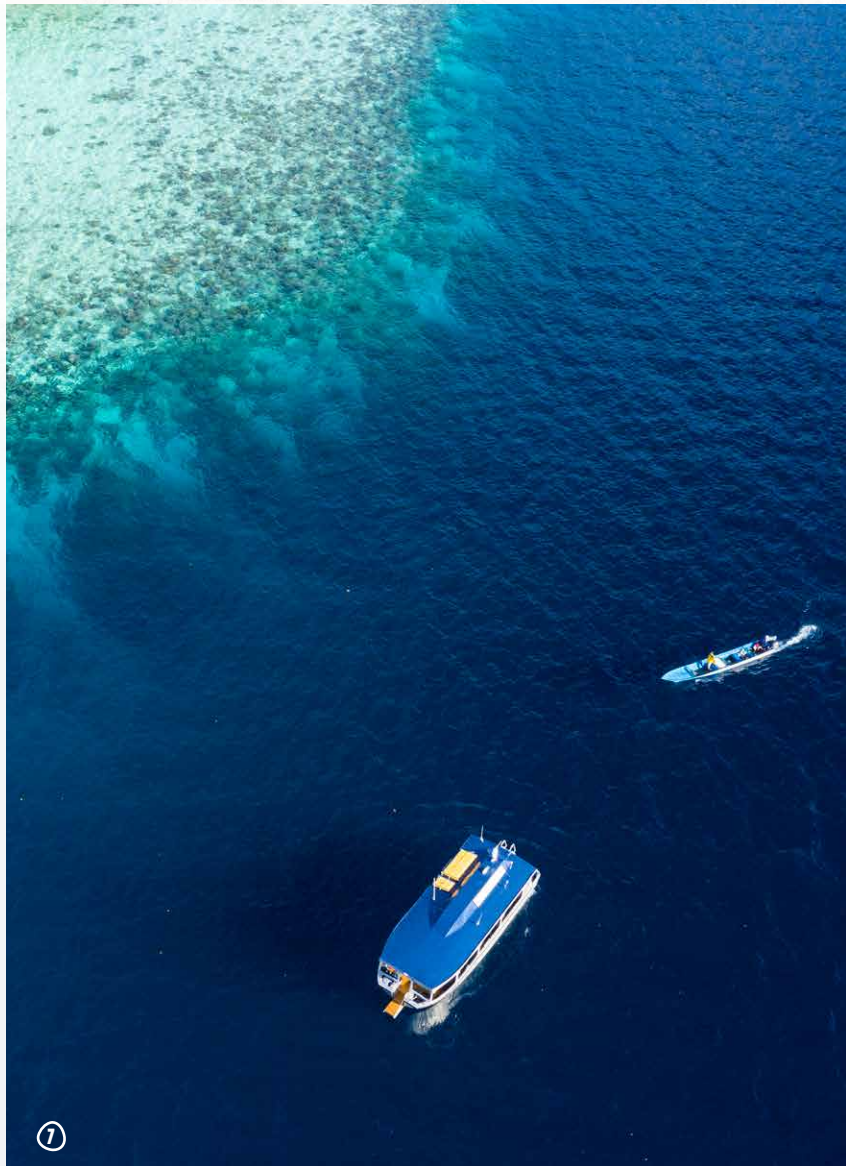
